1. The 2020 outdoor pools lifecycle projects valued at an estimated cost of \$76,875 be approved.

Background

In 2004, an Outdoor Pools Lifecycle Reserve was established to maintain the existing outdoor pools infrastructure. Chatham-Kent has seven operational outdoor swimming pools. The following chart shows the age and construction date of each outdoor pool facility.

	Sidewalk Replacement	Current sidewalk uneven and heaving resulting in a trip hazard.
	Pool heater and platform replacement	Exceeded lifecycle
