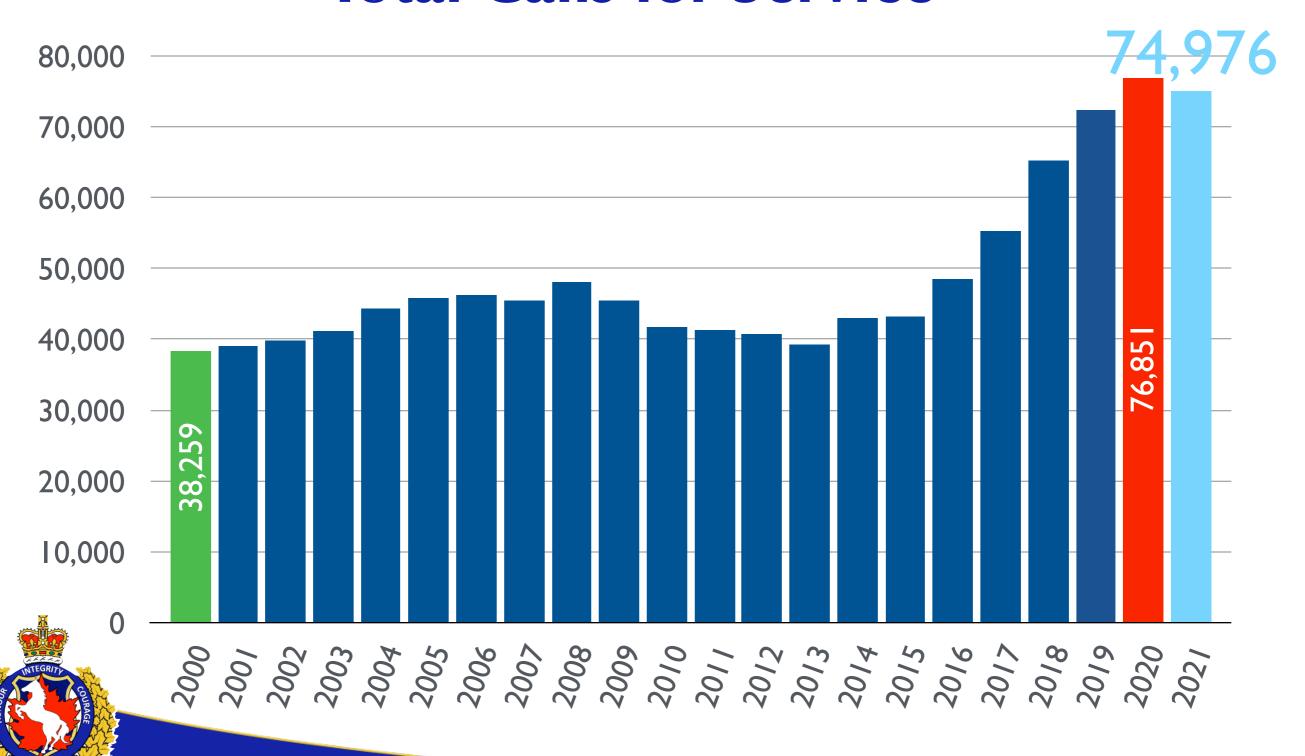

Occurrences Per Year Total Calls for Service

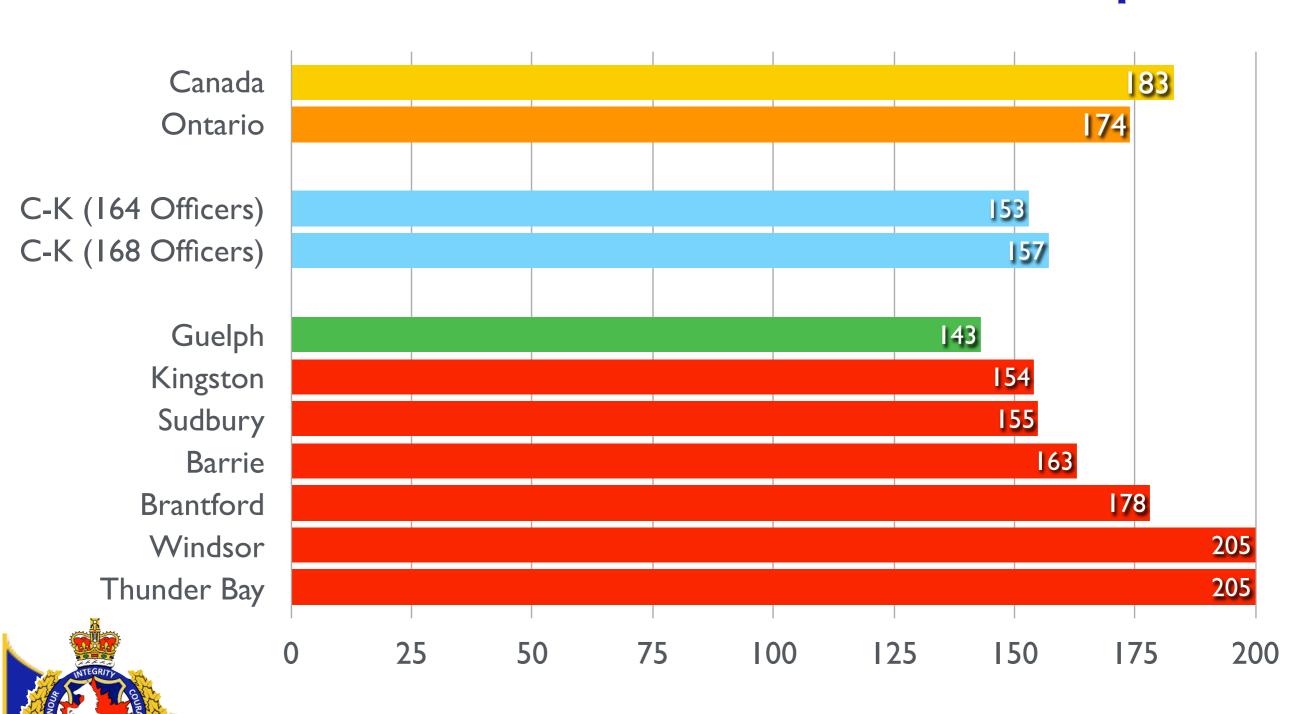


Operating Expenses

 - Some lifecycle equipment (radar units)
 - Crime Prevention, Community Policing
 - Overtime costs (variable)

Chatham-Kent vs. Federal/Provincial/Municipal



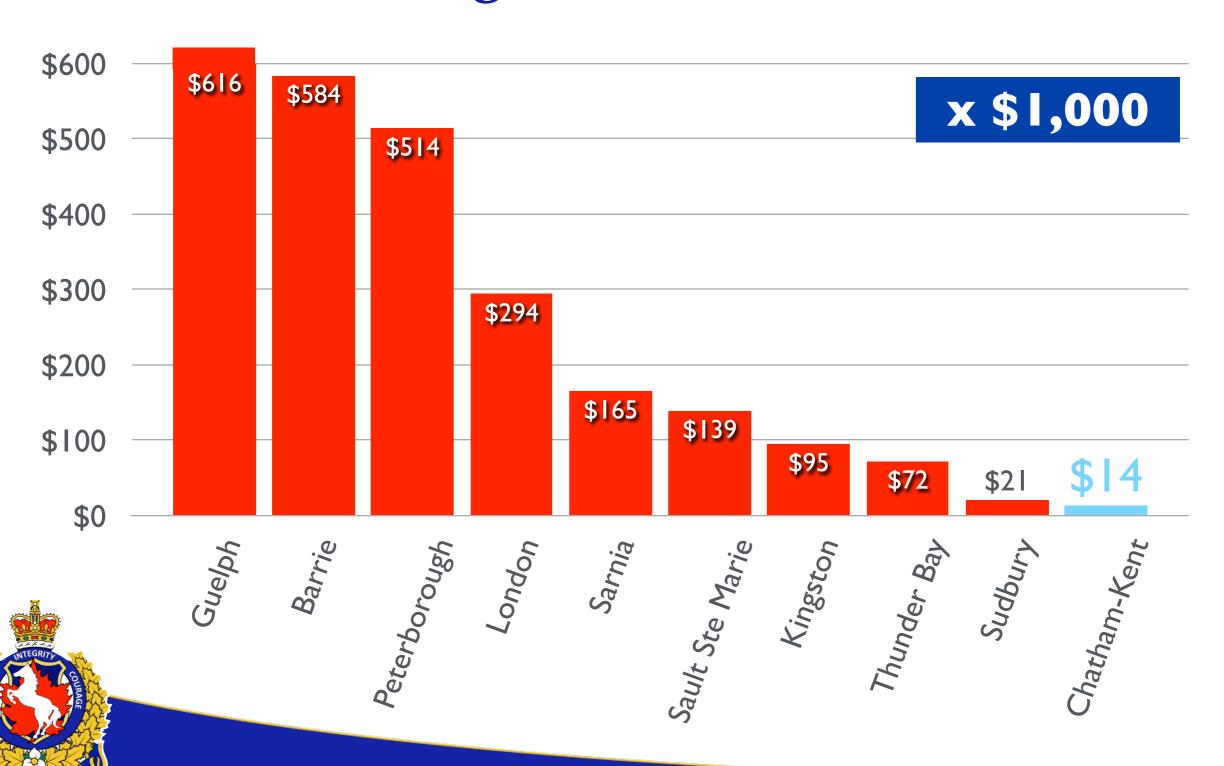

Deployment Efficiency Police Budget / Patrol Area (km²)



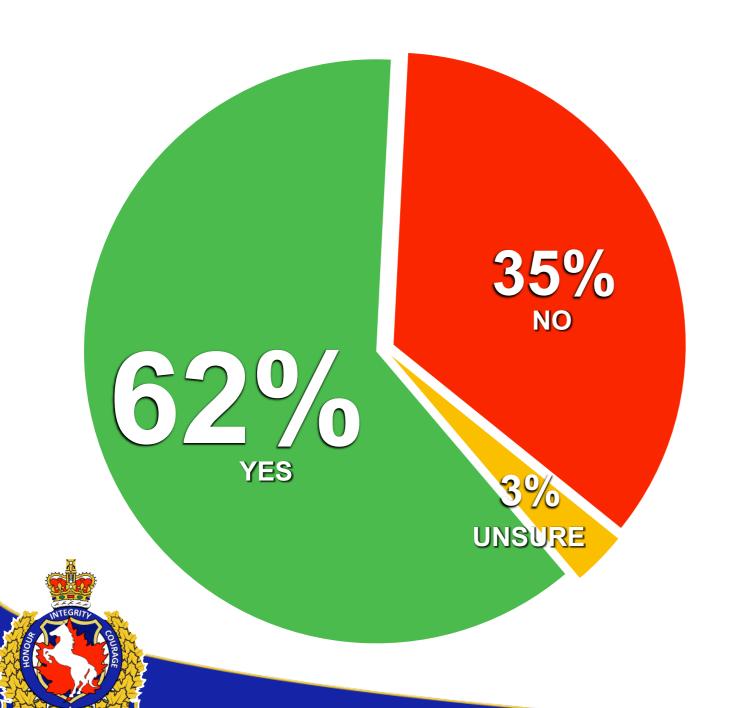

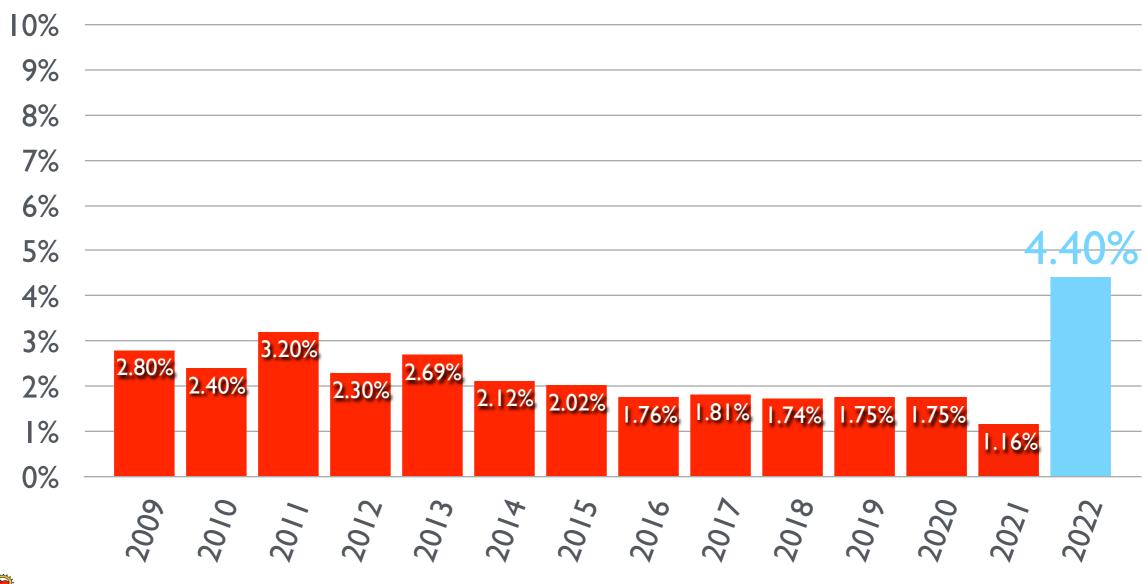


"Would you support an increase to the police budget if the money was used to hire more officers and increase police visibility, or if it went to maintaining the current level of community programs and services?"

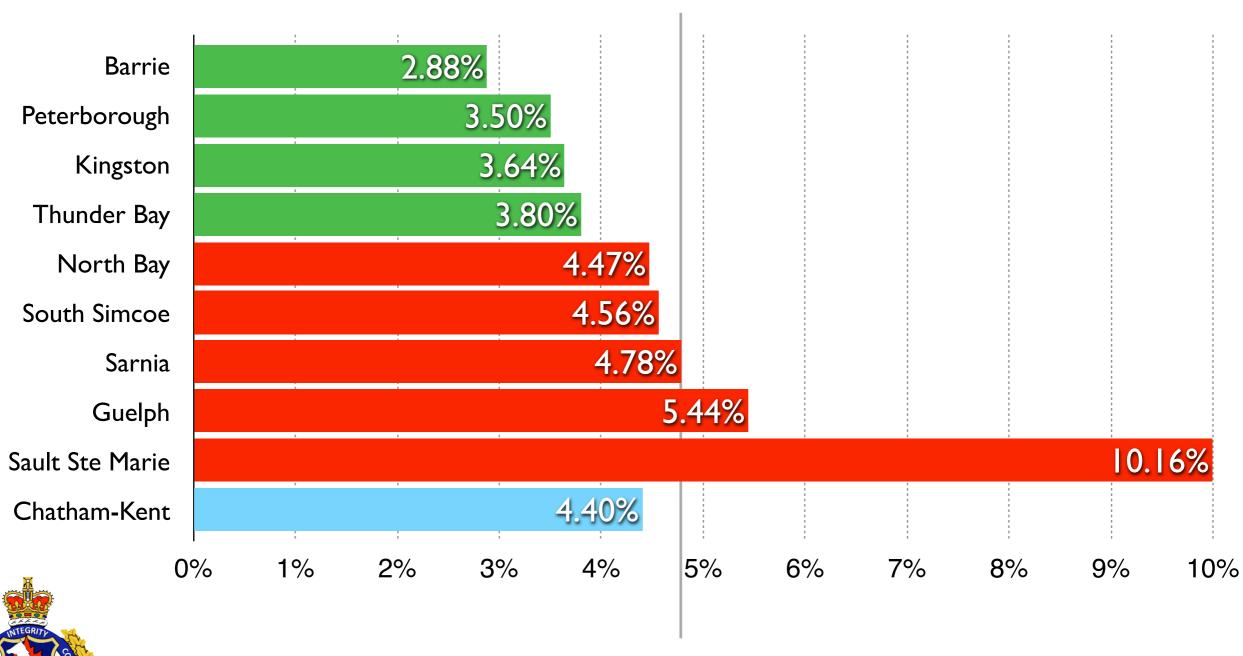
CKPS Budget Increases
