Executive Leaders' Workplace Wellness Summit on Mental Health

The CKCLC hosted a summit to raise awareness on the impact of mental health in the workplace, as well as inspire workplaces to address mental health and encourage dialogue between executive leaders on the challenges of creating a healthy workplace.

Below is how CKCLC has lived out their five guiding principles in the Spotlight Activity...

Individuals are only as healthy as the community they live in.

A key theme of the summit was the workplace can contribute positively or negatively to a person's mental health.

All Chatham-Kent residents have the right to the healthiest life possible.

44% of workers in Canada say they have, or have had, mental health issues. The summit participants heard of ways to ensure all employees have access to support.

Health Equity

Quality of life is dependent on strong leadership in government, business and the social/voluntary sector.

A summit was created to encourage dialogue between executive leaders on the challenges and opportunities to address mental health in the workplace.

Collective Impact

Cross-sectoral Collaboration

No person or group working in isolation can solve complex problems.

The CKCLC created a symposium type presentation of several workplace programs that could be adapted to both large and small work situations.

Involving individuals, groups, and communities as part of the solution is critical.

135 people attended who could champion positive workplace mental health, with 90% of participants stating they would share the information with colleagues.
